### LAW ENFORCEMENT FOR 2014

Mayor Gomes gave a brief summary of negotiations up to this point. At the June 24<sup>th</sup> meeting the city council approved an interlocal agreement for law enforcement services with a proposed amount of \$339,000 for services in 2014. The Chelan County Commissioners did not accept the city's proposal. The Sheriff made a counter proposal which included paying rent for space at city hall. The County Administrator and the Commissioners have approved the counter proposal.

Attorney Chuck Zimmerman explained that he had a lengthy discussion with the County Administrator Cathy Mulhall. There will be two agreements; one for law enforcement services and the other a lease for rent of space at city hall.

The proposal from the county is \$383,100 for law enforcement services for 2014 and \$30,000 rent for space at city hall, which makes the net amount \$14,100 higher than the city's previous offer of \$339,000.

Attorney Zimmerman stated that both agreements would be for four years and both would increase 4% each year. Each agreement is contingent on the other. One agreement cannot be continuous or terminated without the other.

Zimmerman will work with the county on the verbiage of both agreements, which will be presented to council for final approval.

## ANNOUNCEMENTS & INFORMATION

Mayor Gomes reported that he received a call from Mr. Morgan with the Entiat Hot Shots. Mr. Morgan wanted to let the mayor know how happy they were with the service they received for their fundraiser at Riverside Center. John Bryant did everything that he possibly could to make things work for them. They raised over \$10,000 for the families of the firefighters that died.

Director Botello will be issuing a building permit for a new house at 106 Mission View. Also, he will be submitting a federal grant application for improvements to Aplets Way.

Mayor Gomes referred to the complaint letter the council received through email from Mike Redline regarding the pool. The Mayor discussed the letter with staff and Attorney Chuck Zimmerman. Mr. Redline has received a refund for the two pool passes, so as far as the Mayor is concerned the issue has been dealt with and nothing further needs to be done.

## PUBLIC COMMENT

Jill LaRue resides at 107 Fasken Drive and says her neighborhood is no longer quiet because of the industrial fans at Crunch Pak. The new industrial fans were put in last spring. She brought the issue to Crunch Pak's attention and they said they would evaluate it. The fans run 24/7 and she can hear them in her front yard and her back yard. She can't even open her windows because of the noise, which keeps her awake at night. She thinks this noise is almost worse than the train because the fan noise is a constant droning. She is bringing it to the attention of the City because she wants the City to work with Crunch Pak to address the issue.

She understands that industrial business is exempt from the noise ordinance, but she suggested that the City take a closer look at noise issues before issuing permits for expanding or building in the industrial zone.

Vicky Cibicki resides at 301 Fir Crest Drive just east of Crunch Pak and she is also disrupted by the noise and doesn't open her windows due to the constant high frequency noise from the fans.

Alina Cibicki resides at 301 Fir Crest Drive but she is speaking on the noise at the Gillikin's house which is 2 doors down from Best Bite on Division where she house sits a couple of times a week. She can't open the windows because the noise is so loud. The trucks coming and going from the loading dock wake her up at night. The noise is worse since Crunch Pak put in the new fans and built the new loading dock.

## LAW ENFORCEMENT CONTRACT

MOVED by Councilor Bryant and seconded by Councilor Moore to authorize the Mayor and staff to move forward in the negotiations with the Sheriff and the County for the purposes of putting in writing a contract for law enforcement services in the amount of \$383,100 for the year 2014 and a lease for rent of space at City Hall in the amount of \$30,000, payable by the County to the city for the year 2014. Both the law enforcement services agreement and the lease would be for a period of four years and continuation would be continuent on continuation of both agreements until terminated. Motion carried.

### NOISE AT CRUNCH PAK

Councilor Fletcher stated that this is not a regulatory issue, but he would like to see the City advocating on behalf of the neighborhoods, encouraging Crunch Pak to address this issue and work with them to find a solution to break up the sound or deflect the noise upward.

## PUBLIC HEARING ON CHIPMAN ANNEXATION

Director Mark Botello explained that this is a public hearing to receive public input on Ann Chipman's annexation in the West Cashmere area. The annexation boundary is just her

property and a portion of Sunset Highway. Certification from the Assessor has been received and the posting requirements have been met. No action required at this meeting.

Mayor Gomes opened the public hearing at 7:18 p.m. to take public comment on the Chipman annexation.

Stephen Kidd residing at 5633 Evergreen Drive spoke in opposition to the annexation even though he doesn't live in the affected area. He sees how the City gets an area surrounded and then you're stuck, you're in it. He doesn't want to see that happen. He's perfectly happy with the county services.

Steve Bagwell residing at 5963 Larson Street spoke in opposition to the annexation. He is against any annexation in his direction. He doesn't want to be in the City and doesn't want the City rules. He bought property in the county and wants to stay in the county.

Chuck Slowe residing at 5802 Ruby Street spoke in opposition to the annexation. Mr. Slowe is concerned with the possibility of being forced to annex in the future. Annexing the Chipman property creates an island. It would be easy for the City to require the property owners in the island to annex in the future. The City is moving further and further out. He doesn't care if the City expands to the north, south or east, just not to the west. He doesn't want to live in the City. He is happy with the County taxes and services. He's also happy with the City subsidizing the County Sheriff's department.

Public Hearing was closed at 7:26 p.m.

Director Botello confirmed that as far as he was aware the City has never adversely annexed property. Ann Chipman requested that her property be annexed into the City. Nothing changes for the surrounding properties. However, there are no guarantees what a future council may or may not do regarding the island that will be created from annexing the Chipman property.

CHANGE ORDER NO. 1 AND NO. 2 FOR THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT PROJECT Change Order No. 1 was authorized in November 2012. Some of the areas of soil beneath the aeration basin were found to be sub-standard. The cost for excavation, geotextile fabric and crushed rock was \$1,651 plus tax. This amount is less than \$15,000 so it comes out of the \$200,000 minor change category in the original bid, which does not change the original contract price so it doesn't have to be approved by council.

The second part of Change Order No. 1 does need council approval since it increases the original contract number of substantial completion days by 2 days. Substantial completion days change from 790 to 792.

Change Order No. 2 changes the configuration of the fencing at the plant and provides two automated cantilever gates. The change order increases the original contract amount \$37,774 plus sales tax. The change order will be included in the USDA funding.

MOVED by Councilor Fletcher and seconded by Councilor Wynn to approve both Change Order No 1 and Change Order No. 2. Motion carried.

### **ORDINANCE NO. 1215**

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY COMMONLY KNOWN AS THE ANN CHIPMAN PROPERTY AND A PORTION OF SUNSET HIGHWAY RIGHTS-OF-WAY TO THE CITY PURSUANT TO THE PETITION METHOD, SAID ANNEXATION BEING LEGALLY DESCRIBED AS SET FORTH IN EXHIBIT "A" TO THIS ORDINANCE, AND GENERALLY DEPICTED IN THE SURVEY MAP AS SET FORTH IN EXHIBIT "B" TO THIS ORDINANCE; DESIGNATING THE ZONING OF THE ANNEXATION AREA; APPROVING THE TITLE OF THE ORDINANCE; CONTAINING A SEVERABILITY PROVISION; AND PROVIDING EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS,** Petitioner, being the owners as defined in RCW 35A.01.040, of not less than ten percent (10%) in value, according to the assessed valuation of the property for annexation is petitioned, prior to initiation of her petition, notified the City Council of petitioner's intention to commence annexation proceedings for the area commonly known as the Ann Chipman annexation and a portion of Sunset Highway rights-of-way to the City of Cashmere (City); and

**WHEREAS,** the City Council met with said initiating owner on May 13, 2013 and determined by Council action that the City would accept the proposed annexation providing that existing City indebtness shall be assumed by the area to be annexed and further providing that the City's Comprehensive Plan shall be deemed to apply to the area upon such annexation; and

**WHEREAS,** a sufficient petition for annexation was subsequently filed with the City Council pursuant to RCW 35A.14.120, signed by the owner of not less than 10 percent in value, according to the assessed valuation for general taxation, of the property for which annexation is petitioned, seeking annexation to the City of approximately 5.62 acres as legally described in Exhibit "A"; and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to RCW 35A.14.130, the City fixed July 8, 2013, at the hour of 7:00 p.m. as the date and time for a public hearing on said proposed annexation and caused notice of such hearing to be published and posted in accordance with the law, and the hearing having been held on that date and all interested parties appearing at said hearing and desiring to be heard in regard to the proposed annexation having been hard by the Council; and

## The City Council of the City of Cashmere, Washington do ordain as follows:

**Section 1. Annexation.** The real property commonly known as the Ann Chipman Property and a portion of Sunset Highway rights-of-way in Chelan County, Washington described below, contiguous to the City of Cashmere, Washington, and within the City of Cashmere Urban Growth Boundary, are hereby annexed to and incorporated in the city limits of the City of Cashmere, Washington, on the terms and conditions set forth in this ordinance.

## **Description of Real Properties Annexed**

The real property legally described on the attached Exhibit "A" and survey map on the attached Exhibit "B" incorporated herein by this reference.

**Section 2. Zoning.** Zoning of the annexation area shall be Multi-Family (MF), the zoning depicted in the "Map of the Cashmere Zoning Ordinance". The City Clerk/Treasure is directed to insert this zoning for the annexation area on the "Map of the Cashmere Zoning Ordinance" when this Ordinance becomes effective.

**Section 3. Comprehensive Plan.** The annexed real property shall be subject to the Comprehensive Land Use Plan adopted heretofore by the City of Cashmere, Washington. The annexed real property is hereby zoned in accordance with the Comprehensive Plan as Multi-Family (MF), as set forth in the City of Comprehensive Plan Land Use Designation Map.

**Section 4. Taxation.** The annexed real property described herein shall be assessed and taxed at the same rate and on the same basis as other properties in the City of Cashmere, Washington to pay for all or any portion of the outstanding indebtedness of the City of Cashmere, approved by the voters, contracted or incurred prior to or existing at the date of annexation.

**Section 5. Summary.** The title of this Ordinance and Exhibits "A" and "B" to this Ordinance collectively are hereby approved as a summary of this Ordinance.

**Section 6. Publication.** The City Clerk/Treasure is hereby directed to cause a summary of this Ordinance to be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City and the City's official newspaper. The City Clerk/Treasure is further directed to file certified copies of this ordinance with the Board of Commissioners for Chelan County, Chelan County Auditor and Chelan County Assessor.

**Section 7. Severability.** If any section, sentence clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence clause or phrase of this ordinance.

**Section 8. Effective Date.** This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force five (5) days after the ordinance or a summary thereof consisting of the title is published.
