Director Mark Botello reported that the two new street lights on S. Douglas Street have been installed by Chelan PUD as requested.

Minutes of November 14, 2016 Regular Council Meeting Payroll and Claims Packet Dated November 28, 2016

MOVED by Councilor Moore and seconded by Councilor Erickson to approve the items on the consent agenda. Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING ON FINAL BUDGET FOR 2017

Mayor Gomes opened the Public Hearing at 6:03 p.m. to receive public comment on the Final Budget for 2017. The Budget letter from Mayor Gomes shows two years of actual budget numbers to compare to previous years. The major changes in revenues and expenditures are summarized in the letter and the capital projects and purchases are listed.

Clerk-Treasurer Kay Jones stated that the \$400,000 transfer to the Wastewater Capital fund was eliminated in the Final Budget to keep from drawing down the ending fund balance. The 2017 estimated revenues cover operating costs but do not cover all of the capital transfer amounts.

Mayor Gomes discussed the concerns regarding the Water/Wastewater fund and informed the council that he will be looking into staffing levels and making an effort to reduce overtime. Also, a rate study is scheduled for 2017 to look at water and wastewater rates to make certain the rates are where they should be to cover expenses.

Councilor Fletcher stated that after doing a quick calculation into the future the current service levels of the City are not sustainable. His recommendation is to start educating the citizens now so they understand that service levels will need to be reduced or taxes will need to be raised to maintain the service levels.

The Mayor closed the Hearing at 6:12 p.m.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

The Committee Members Councilors Derrick Pratt and Kameon Smith met with Sheriff Burnett and School Superintendent Glenn Johnson to discuss the School Resource Officer (SRO). Both Councilors Pratt and Smith like the idea of the SRO program. However, after reviewing the proposed 2017 budget and discussing options. The committee recommended Option #1, which was to wait until the new Law Enforcement contract for 2018-2021 is negotiated to determine if the City can afford to participate in the program.

MOVED by Councilor Fletcher and seconded by Councilor Smith to accept the committee's recommendation of Option #1 to wait until the new Law Enforcement contract for 2018-2021 is negotiated. Motion carried.

PROGRESS REPORTS

Director Botello reported that he worked with the Fire Department to submit a grant for 169,000 for 20 SCBA's which include batteries, mask and the tank. The City's match would be 5%. If the City is awarded the grant the budget will be amended.

ADJOURNMENT

Mayor Gomes adjourned the meeting at 6:18 p.m.

ORDINANCE NO. 1256

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF CASHMERE, WASHINGTON, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2017.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Cashmere has heretofore made and filed its preliminary budget for the year 2017 and has given notice of the time and place of hearing thereon according to law and met in accordance with said notice and considered the proposed budget, including salaries for all city employees;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Cashmere, Washington do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Adoption of budget. In accordance with RCW 35A.33.075 the final budget for the year ending December 31, 2017 to carry on the government of the City of Cashmere, Washington, is hereby adopted at the fund level. Exhibit A (attached) is a summary of the totals of estimated revenues and appropriations for each separate fund and an aggregate total for all such funds combined. Exhibit B (attached) is an employee salary schedule.

<u>Section 2</u>. <u>Copy of detailed budget on file.</u> A detailed final budget adopting the salary schedule for 2017 and including a list of the revenues and expenditures for each separate fund is on file in the Office of the City Clerk and is adopted by this reference.

<u>Section 3</u>. This ordinance shall be in effect five (5) days after its passage and publication of an approved summary thereof consisting of the title.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN CHELAN COUNTY, WASHINGTON AND THE CITY OF CASHMERE, WASHINGTON, FOR THE HOUSING OF INMATES IN THE CHELAN COUNTY **REGIONAL JUSTICE CENTER**

This Amendment is made by Chelan County and the City of Cashmere for the purpose of amending the current contract entered into between Chelan County and the City of Cashmere.

Whereas the purpose of this contract amendment is to amend the rate.

The following section is amended, in part, as follows;

COMPENSATION 6.

(b) Rate for 2017. The sum is based upon the average number of monthly post-release actual inmate usage generated from the city during the period from January 2013 to December 2015 with the daily cost per inmate of \$73.50 per day. The parties agree that Chelan County will not charge the City a separate booking fee in addition to such annual compensation. The date of booking into CCRJC of the City's inmates, no matter how little time of a twenty-four (24) hour day it constitutes, shall count as one (1) day. The annual cost for 2017 will be \$28,789.32 with monthly payments calculated at the annual rate divided by twelve (12) months for a monthly rate of \$2,399.11.

All other provisions in the contract remain in full force and effect.
