ANNOUNCEMENTS & INFORMATION

Councilor Erickson reported that he attended the first trail meeting. The following entities and organizations are at the table working together to develop a Comprehensive Trails Plan for Chelan County; Cities of Wenatchee and Cashmere, Chelan County, Transportation Council, Land Trust, Forest Service and the Wenatchee Valley Tread. The purpose is to inventory all the trails in the county, motorized trails, non-motorized trails and the various types and uses. Dave Erickson represents both Wenatchee and Cashmere at the trail meetings.

Councilor Scott reported that the Goodwin Bridge project bid opening is February 4th. Due to the Bridge project, Chelan County PUD will be working on relocating powerlines. Information on the project and location of the powerlines being relocated will be available at City Hall.

The PUD has asked to use the Mulching Center as a staging area for the project. An agreement will be presented to Council at a later meeting for approval.

Mayor Fletcher will be traveling to Olympia in the morning to meet and speak with the Legislators on City matters.

ORDINANCE NO. 1287 REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 1286 DESIGNATING THE WENATCHEE WORLD AS THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF THE CITY

Bill Forhan, owner of the Cashmere Valley Record, spoke to the Council on the trickle-down affect it would have on his business if the City changed their official newspaper to the Wenatchee World. It wasn't about losing the City's account, it was all the accounts he would lose if his paper was not the designated official newspaper. He also believed it would hurt the City of Cashmere if they did not stay with the local newspaper.

Mayor Fletcher apologized to Bill Forhan, for not communicating with him prior to the subject of designating an official newspaper came before the City Council. The goal behind the decision to change the official newspaper was to get the legal publications out faster, meeting our publication requirements in a shorter amount of time. Even if the notices go online, the publication requirements start when the notice is printed in the official paper of record.

The Mayor recommended approval of Ordinance No. 1287 repealing Ordinance No. 1286 that designated the Wenatchee World as the official newspaper of the City. Approving the proposed ordinance would reset the Cashmere Valley Record as the official newspaper for the City. The City can then go through the proper bidding process to look at not only cost but timeline for publication.

MOVED by Councilor Pratt and seconded by Councilor Erickson to approve Ordinance No. 1287 Repealing Ordinance No. 1286 and affirming continuation of the Cashmere Valley record as the official newspaper of the City. Motion carried 5-0.

RESOLUTION NO. 01-2020 ADDING THE MAYOR AND CLERK-TREASURER TO THE CITY CELL PHONE POLICY

Under the current cell phone policy, the Fire Chief and the Director of Operations receive a monthly stipend of twenty dollars to use their personal cell phone for City business. The proposed resolution adds the Mayor and Clerk-Treasurer to the policy.

MOVED by Councilor Erickson and seconded by Councilor Carlson to approve Resolution No. 01-2020 adding the Mayor and Clerk-Treasurer to the City Cell Phone Policy. Motion carried 5-0.

LEASE AGREEMENT

This Lease Agreement ("Agreement") is made by and between the City of Cashmere, a Washington municipal corporation (the "City"), and Chelan County Public Utilities District No. 1, a Washington municipal corporation (the "PUD"). The City and PUD may be referred to herein individually as a "Party" or collectively as the "Parties." The Parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Premises</u>. The real property leased by the City to the PUD shall consist of the area of land on Hagman Road, east of and adjacent to the City's mulching center identified as the "Proposed Lay Down and Construction Staging Area" in the map attached as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Premises").
- Lease Term. The term of this Agreement shall be from February 1, 2020 to November 31, 2020 (the "Lease Term") and may be extended, in writing, by mutual agreement of the Parties.
- 3. Consideration. In addition to the PUD Payment provided for below herein, consideration for the lease of the Premises by the City to the PUD shall be in the form of the use of the Premises made by the PUD as further defined below herein. The City finds that the use of the Premises for the purposes described below herein provides benefit to the City and its citizens by facilitating the improvement of power facilities that provide electricity to the City. This benefit and PUD Payment are roughly approximate in value to the reasonable monthly rental payments the City could charge to a third party to rent the Premises.
- 4. <u>Use of Premises</u>. The PUD shall use the Premises as a construction staging area for PUD equipment, transmission poles, hardware, and PUD contractor/subcontractor equipment in order to facilitate the PUD's work prior to the Washington State Department of Transportation Goodwin Bridge replacement construction project.
- 5. <u>Security</u>. The PUD shall provide its own security for the Premises and understands that the City does not guarantee the safety or security of PUD property or PUD contractor/subcontractor property. The City will work with the PUD to agree on a uniform method of access to the Premises through the gate across Hagman road.
- 6. <u>Interference</u>. The City's use of the mulching center shall continue during the Lease Term. The PUD agrees not to interfere with the City's use of the mulching center and Hagman Road during the Lease Term and any extension.
- 7. Premises Condition. The PUD accepts the Premises "as is" and agrees to maintain the Premises in its present condition during the Lease Term. At the end of the Lease Term and any extension, or upon termination of this Agreement by either Party, the PUD agrees to remove and clear the Premises of all PUD and PUD contractor/subcontractor equipment and hardware. If the Premises are damaged by the PUD, its employees, officers, contractors, subcontractors, invitees, and/or agents, the PUD shall repair the Premises to the condition the Premises were in as of the Effective Date of this Agreement.

- 8. <u>Termination</u>. This Agreement may be cancelled by the PUD on thirty (30) days written notice upon determination the use of the Premises are not required. Notwithstanding the above, in the event permits are required, the PUD may elect to terminate the Agreement.
- 9. <u>Alterations to Premises</u>. The PUD shall make no alterations to the Premises unless specifically provided written permission to do so by the City. Any alterations to the Premises shall immediately become the property of the City, unless otherwise agreed by the City and the PUD at the time the alterations are approved by the City.
- 10. Permits. If the City or another permitting authority determines there is a legal requirement to obtain a permit prior to the PUD use of the Premises for the purposes provided in this Agreement, the PUD shall apply for and pay all of the costs to obtain any such permit(s) and the City will cooperate with the PUD in its efforts to obtain any such permit(s). The City has made the initial determination that the temporary nature of the intended use of the Premises for storage by the PUD and its contractors does not require the PUD or its contractors to obtain a Shoreline Substantial Development Permit. The City reserves the right to change this initial decision depending on the position taken by other agencies, including the State of Washington Department of Ecology.
- 11. <u>Assignment of Lease</u>. The PUD shall not assign or sublease the Premises or use or occupy the Premises for any purposes other than those identified in this Agreement. The PUD is specifically granted permission to permit its contractors and subcontractors to use the Premises during the Lease Term and any extension.
- 12. <u>Notices</u>. Notices under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be hand delivered or sent by First Class U. S. Mail to the last known address of the Party to whom the notice is to be given, as designated by such Party in writing. The City and PUD hereby designate their addresses as follows:

- 13. <u>Indemnification</u>. The PUD agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City from and against any and all claims that may occur as a result of the use of the Premise by the PUD, its contractors and subcontractors, unless a claim is caused by the sole negligence of the City.
- 14. <u>PUD Payment</u>. The PUD shall reimburse the City for the City's costs incurred to prepare this Agreement up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000).
- 15. <u>Default</u>. Any material violation by the PUD or its contractors or subcontractors of any provision of this Agreement shall be considered a default and subject the Agreement to immediate termination by the City.

16. <u>Effective Date</u>. The Effective Date of this Agreement shall be the date it is signed by the City Mayor.
