

City of Cashmere 2021-2022 Collection Schedule

PLEASE POST

Please place containers at the curb by 6:00 a.m.

- Three (3) feet apart with lids opening toward street
- At Least three (3) feet from car, trees and mailboxes
- Within 5 feet from the main road

Please remove containers as soon as possible after collection

Recycling collected on blue weeks on garbage day.

If collection falls on or after Thanksgiving (Nov 25), collection is **one day later** that week including pick up on Saturday. On all other 2021 holiday weeks set your carts out on your regularly scheduled service day.

In an extreme inclement weather event, visit servicealerts.wmnorthwest.com to learn about any weather related service delays. If weather conditions prevent safe collection, up to twice as much garbage and recyclables will be collected at no extra charge on your next regular collection day. No credits will be issued for collection delays due to weather.

LOCAL RECYCLING RESOURCES

Some items such as medical wastes, fluorescent bulbs and tubes, needles, fuel tanks, electronics and chemicals are hazardous and not allowed in garbage or recycling.

Latex and water based paint - solidify by opening lid, or mixing kitty litter. Once dry, treat as household waste.

RECYCLABLES



Clean Paper and Cardboard

Mail, envelopes, newspaper, flattened cardboard, magazines, catalogs, phone books, paper boxes (cereal, etc.)



Clean Plastic Bottles

Plastic bottles (clean and empty)



Clean Metal Cans

Aluminum & tin cans (no sharp or greasy metal)



When in doubt, throw it out.

ONLY listed items should go in your recycle bin.

RECYCLING TIPS

NEW

- All recycling must fit in your cart with the lid closed. Extra charges will apply for material left outside or on top of your cart. For occasional extra recycling, use a cardboard box or personal can and label it "Recycle". No plastic bags accepted. Additional recycle carts are also available for an extra charge.
- Help ensure recyclables have a second life by ONLY putting recyclables pictured on this guide in your recycle cart.
- Non-recyclable items in your cart may be subject to a contamination charge.

- Blue recycling carts are emptied every-other-week (see enclosed calendar)

NEW

GARBAGE

These Items are not recyclable. Please put them in your grey garbage cart.

NO HAZARDOUS WASTE, medical waste, fluorescent bulbs or tubes, needles, liquids, fuel tanks, computers or TVs in garbage or recycling

Non-recyclable plastic

All these items go into your garbage cart.



Glass

- Window Panes, Mirrors
- Ceramics, Dishware, Broken Glass
- Standard Light Bulbs
- Glass Bottles and Jars



Non-recyclable paper

- Food Soiled Paper
- Paper Towels
- Shiny, Coated or Foil Paper
- Hardcover Books (donate to a charity or school)



Non-recyclable metal

- Latex Paint Cans (harden paint with kitty litter or paint hardener, then place in garbage)
- Lids and Caps
- Sharp Metal
- Small Appliances (donate to a charity if working)



GARBAGE TIPS

- Always bag all garbage.
- Double bag pet waste, packing pellets, vacuum dust, sawdust and cold ashes.
- Garbage charges** are based on cart size. There is a charge for extra garbage that does not fit in your cart with the lid closed.
- Weight limit: 32-gal/65 lbs for your collector's safety.
- Bulky item collection available on Mondays for an additional charge. Call by the Friday before to schedule.
