EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR JEFF WILKINS, WENATCHEE VALLEY TRANSPORTATION COUNCIL (WVTC) Jeff Wilkins, Executive Director for Wenatchee Valley Transportation Council explained the purpose and goals of the WVTC and the difference between the WVTC and the North Central Regional Transportation Planning Organization (NCRTPO). If the City were to be a member of the WVTC the annual dues would be \$11,000.

DNR INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT FOR PUBLIC TREE INVENTORY

Directory Botello explained that the public tree inventory is a pilot program through the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). The DNR will perform public tree inventory for the City

at no cost. The primary data that will be collected includes location, species, diameter, condition, maintenance needs and priority, and proximity to utility lines, traffic signs and signals.

The City of Cashmere is the fourth oldest "Tree City USA" in the State of Washington. Director Botello recommends the initial public tree inventory be performed by the DNR and then maintained in the future by city staff.

MOVED by Councilor Fletcher and seconded by Councilor Bryant to approve the DNR Interagency Agreement for Public Tree Inventory. Motion Carried.

DISCUSSION OF WATER MAIN ON TREE TOP PROPERTY - NO ACTION NEEDED

Director Bob Schmidt informed the council that Blue Star Growers approached Cashmere Investment Group (CIG) requesting to connect to the water main on the highway side of their building. CIG approached the City inquiring as to whether the City would be willing to take possession of the water mains on the property if CIG was willing to deed utility easements to the City. Director Schmidt and City Attorney Chuck Zimmerman believe taking possession of the water mains would be logical and beneficial for the City. The majority of the water mains the City would be taking possession of are 10 inch ductile and cast iron steel that is in good condition. There is a portion that will need to be updated in the future,

Director Schmidt stated that no action was needed at the time. If the Council had no objections to taking possession of the water mains he would give CIG the approval to move forward. No objections were voiced.

PROGRESS REPORTS

Director Mark Botello stated that the park improvements project includes a skate park and restroom facilities along with the grassy areas and the asphalt and parking improvements. The City has a nice project and a good grant application. Director Botello reported that he has received several commitments for donations for the park improvements that are contingent on receiving the park grant. He will be presenting the project in Olympia in August.

Mayor Gomes reported that they had the annual oversight committee with law enforcement. It was a good meeting and the Mayor stated that he feels the department is listening.

Director Schmidt reported that the Riverfront Utility Extension project is completed and the final documents to release funds for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Project have been received.

FINAL PUBLIC SAFETY REPORT

Consultant Tom Davis began the meeting by thanking the Sheriff's office for being very open and helpful in providing the information needed to complete the Public Safety Report. The surveys council and staff completed were very helpful also.

Mr. Davis presented his Public Safety Report, briefly explaining each section and answering questions and concerns.

One of the main questions for both cities is; what is the minimum level of service cities must provide and what is that minimum service level based on? Mr. Davis explained that both cities are considered Code Cities and as such, are required to appoint a chief law enforcement officer per RCW 35A.12.020. Other than this requirement to appoint a chief law enforcement officer, there appears to be no minimum required service level.

Currently the level of service is determined by the philosophy of the Sheriff's Office since they are providing the service. Mr. Davis stated that the agency providing the service should be able to set the level of services for safety and liability.

One of the main concerns stated was that we elect the Sheriff, but we don't negotiate with the Sheriff. The Cities have to negotiate with the County Commissioners and the Commissioners weren't willing to negotiate. A signed contract was presented to Cashmere and Leavenworth to sign, no negotiation was involved.

Mr. Davis discussed direct costs versus indirect costs and how they affect the overall cost of the contracts. Whenever indirect/shared costs are involved there are different methodologies on how those costs are charged out. He strongly encouraged that contract negotiations center on and use direct costs as much as possible.

Support functions required for law enforcement services specifically provided by the Sheriff's Office such as the cost of records personnel, administrative personnel, and detectives are included in the cost recovery. This is a widely accepted method of cost recovery. Indirect costs for entities outside the Sheriff's Office such as auditor, treasurer, and commissioners are not included in the cost recovery.

Mr. Davis stated that the overall budget methodology and formatting utilized by the Chelan County Sheriff's office is a commonly used and widely accepted method. Cashmere and Leavenworth represent over 27% of the total revenue for the Chelan County Sheriff's Office.

Total Revenues are as follows:

All City Contracts: \$1,694,376,
Grants funding staffed positions: \$ 978,651
All other revenues: \$ 105,758
Total Revenues \$2,778,786

The councils discussed that the cities need to have a stronger level of influence with respect to the level, degree and type of City services received. The Cities need to identify their own philosophy to see if it mirrors the Sheriff's philosophy. The cities need to decide what they want to have happen, what their needs and priorities are and what they want the deputies to focus on. The needs of the cities may change from time to time.

The cities can have 24 hour coverage if that's what they want, but it is going to cost them. The cities each pay for three (3) full-time employees (FTE). It would take 5.7 FTE's to have 24/7 coverage. The additional employees are needed to cover training, sick leave, vacation leave and disability. Additional FTE's coverage is higher for public safety; you have to be able to cover the employee that is out on leave.

Mr. Davis discussed the start up and annual operating costs of operating a Leavenworth-Cashmere Police Department (LCPD). The comparison model (for current operations) showed the annual operating costs for a LCPD at \$1,006,799, compared to the 2012 Chelan County contract total for both cities at \$944,768.

Other scenarios showing the estimated start up and annual operating costs for a LCPD: Eight commissioned employees and one civilian employee: \$1,200,590 operating and \$440,560 start up. Ten commissioned employees and one civilian employee: \$1,446,719 operating and \$555,217 start up.

A small portion of undeveloped right-of-way remains after the re-alignment and installation of the new River Street and Sunset Highway project. This small portion of right-of-way is approximately 600 square feet in size (Please see attached picture).

Crunch Pak offered to purchase this property for \$900 and pay for the applicable survey/legal description and recording fees. Staff utilized the same valuation process used during the original September 2011 River Street and Sunset highway vacation process.

Staff would like to have the \$900 applied towards the Riverside Park improvements project. This would be similar to the Fisher Street process.

Staff will go over this in more detail at the Cashmere Council meeting.

RESOLUTION NO. 06-2012

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CASHMERE, WASHINGTON, SETTING A DATE AND TIME FOR A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER THE VACATION OF A PORTION OF RIVER STREET.

WHEREAS, the City has received a Petition for the vacation of a portion of River Street from Crunch Pak, LLC, (hereinafter referred as "Crunch Pak") the owners of 100% of the property abutting the portion of River Street proposed to be vacated; and

WHEREAS, City Director of Planning and Building has reviewed the Petition, found it to be complete, and determined that an appraisal is not necessary due to the size and proposed terms and conditions of the street vacation petition which the City Director of Planning and Building has determined are in the best interests of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Director of Planning and Building recommends passage of this Resolution to schedule a public hearing to consider the petition for vacation of a portion of River Street and the terms associated with the petition as set forth in the Petition for Street Vacation, a copy of which is attached hereto and marked as Exhibit "A" and contains within it a depiction of the River Street right of way proposed to be vacated; and

WHEREAS, the City Council agrees that a public hearing should be scheduled to consider this proposed street vacation; now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CASHMERE, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The date and time of a public hearing for consideration of the petition for

vacation of a portion of River Street as set forth in Exhibit "B" to this Resolution should be

scheduled not less than twenty (20) days from the date of passage of this Resolution, but not

more than sixty (60) days after the date of passage of this Resolution pursuant to CMC

12.30.050, therefore the date and time for a public hearing to consider vacation of the

aforementioned portion of River Street is hereby scheduled for 7:00 p.m. on Monday, the 24th

day of September, 2012, at Cashmere City Hall, 101 Woodring Street, Cashmere, Washington.

Section 2. The City Clerk is directed to provide at least twenty days notice of this

Petition for Street Vacation by posting a copy of this Resolution and Exhibit "B" to this

Resolution in three of the most public places in the City and in a conspicuous place on River

Street. In addition, the City Clerk is directed to provide a copy of this Resolution by mail to each

owner of property abutting any part of River Street at least 15 days prior to the public hearing

scheduled in Section 1 of this Resolution.

Section 3. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon passage by the City

Council.







RE: Riverfront Drive Water and Sewer Extensions Project, Change Order #3

See the sketch below. This change order is due to finding the old abandoned sewer main along lagoon cell #1 further into the roadway than anticipated. The line was also still full of water and after closing a valve that we found open still flowed some water. So the two new wastewater lines were installed further into the roadway. Thus more asphalt grinding gravel resurfacing and asphalt repair. This change order also includes a repair of a sunken piece of asphalt (after it was resurfaced) near the City lift station that was caused by natural ground water. The increase in the project cost from change order #3 is \$13,132.07.

See the sketch below. This change order is due to finding the old abandoned sewer main along lagoon cell #1 further into the roadway than anticipated and extending North into the intersection where the two existing wastewater mains needed to be connected to and extended. Because of the interference of the old steel line the connections needed to be re-designed requiring additional time, fittings backfill etc. The increase in the project cost from change order #4 is \$8,528.19.

The parties continue to reserve all rights under the formal procedures of Section 626 of Title VI of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and do not waive any rights related thereto. Charter shall not be required to send another request for renewal of its Franchise under 626 as a result of this Extension.
